The Department of Aging and Adult Services requests authorization to modify the existing grant agreement with Leah's Pantry for the time period beginning September 1, 2019 and ending June 30, 2020, in the amount of \$48,585 plus a 10% contingency for a total not to exceed amount of \$347,186. The purpose of this modification is to increase the number of nutrition education sessions and counseling hours available through the Citywide Nutrition Education and Counseling Services Program.

Background

DAAS provides funding to multiple community partners to offer congregate and home-delivered meal programs for older adults and adults with disabilities throughout the City. The congregate and home-delivered meal programs are intended to improve the dietary intake of participants and

to offer participants opportunities to create informal support networks. As a supporting part of the meal programs, Leah's Pantry provides citywide nutrition education workshops and one-on-one counseling services to eligible older adults and adults with disabilities who are enrolled in DAAS funded congregate or home-delivered meal programs, and who have been screened as being at high nutritional risk using the DETERMINE Your Nutritional Health Checklist developed by the Nutrition Screening Initiative.

Through the Citywide Nutrition Education and Counseling Program, eligible consumers can receive advice and guidance from a Registered Dietitian (RD) about food and nutrition, their nutritional status, and options and methods for improving their nutritional status, which contributes to greater overall health and wellbeing. This program has consistently demonstrated its impact; program participants receiving Citywide Nutrition Education and Counseling services from Leah's Pantry report an increase in fruit and vegetable consumption, knowledge of foods and beverages that are beneficial to overall health, and report making a healthy change to improve their health.

Grant Modification

The purpose of this modification is to increase the number of nutrition counseling hours and group education sessions available through the Citywide Nutrition Education and Counseling Services Program to provide services to more eligible consumers who are identified as being at high nutritional risk. The additional hours will help Leah's Pantry reach the growing number of consumers that are referred for nutrition counseling or workshops by congregate and home-delivered meal providers.

Services to be Provided

Leah's Pantry offers nutrition counseling to individuals screened and identified at high nutritional risk using the DETERMINE Your Nutritional Health Checklist. Nutrition counseling is provided by a Registered Dietitian (RD) and conducted in person at an OOA partner site or over the phone. The RD offers individualized advice and guidance to eligible consumers based on the information provided in their DETERMINE Your Nutritional Health Checklist and/or based on their health or nutritional history, dietary intake, medications use, or chronic illnesses. Eligible consumers are identified in CA-GetCare through a Citywide Nutrition Referral Dashboard.

Leah's Pantry is conducting outreach at meal sites and community partner sites to promote the availability of the Citywide Nutrition Education and Counseling Services Program, as well as publicize it through the mail and phone to eligible consumers. The outreach also includes contacting eligible consumers at nutritional risk to schedule a nutrition counseling session with the RD.

In fiscal year 2019-2020, Leah's Pantry is increasing their nutrition counseling and counseling outreach hours from a total of 374 hours to 785 hours and provide nutrition counseling services to an additional 154 consumers for a total of 275.

Leah's Pantry is offering citywide nutrition education in a group setting at various OOA meal sites and other community partner sites. Nutrition education consists of a one hour class and/or

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session lead by qualified staff and is focusing on nutrition related health and wellness practices such as healthful eating habits, improving food selection, and disease prevention.

Leah's Pantry provides quarterly nutrition sessions at designated congregate meal sites to fulfill the nutrition compliance Title III-C and DAAS nutrition program requirements.

In fiscal year 2019-2020, Leah's Pantry is increasing the number of nutrition education classes from 103 to 157 to reach an additional 127 consumers for a total of 327.

Grantee Performance

Leah's Pantry is in compliance with fiscal and programmatic requirements for fiscal year 2018-2019 for this grant.

Grantee Selection

Grantee was selected through RFP #715 issued in January 2017.

Funding

This grant modification is funded through the Dignity Fund.

Citywide Nutrition Education and Counseling Services for Congregate and Home-Delivered Meals Programs July 1, 2017– June 30, 2020

Modification: September 1, 2019

I. Purpose

The purpose of this grant is to provide nutrition education and counseling services to older adults and adults with disabilities who are enrolled in a DAAS-OOA funded congregate or home-delivered meal program and who are at nutritional risk as evidenced by the DETERMINE Your Nutritional Health Checklist.

II. Definitions

Home-Delivered Meals (HDM)

LGBTQ+

Home-delivered meals are provided to consumers who are frail and homebound by reason of illness, disability, isolation, lack of support network and have no safe, healthy alternative for meals.

An acronym/term used to refer to persons who self-identify as non -heterosexual and/or whose gender identity does not correspond to their birth sex. This includes, but is not limited to, lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, genderqueer, and gender non-binary

Low-Income Having income at or below 300% of the federal poverty line defined by the federal Bureau of the Census and published annually by the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services. Used by consumers to self-identify their income status and is not used as a means test to qualify for the program.

Minority

An ethnic person of color who is any of the following:

a) Black – a person having origins in any of the Black racial groups of Africa, b) Hispanic – a person of Mexican, Puerto Rican, Cuban, Central or South American, or other Spanish or Portuguese culture or origin regardless of race, c) Asian/Pacific Islander – a person whose origins are from India, Pakistan or Bangladesh, Japan, China, Taiwan, Korea, Vietnam, Laos, Cambodia, the Philippines, Samoa, Guam, or the United States Territories of the Pacific including the Northern Marianas, d) American Indian/Alaskan Native – an American Indian, Eskimo, Aleut, or Native Hawaiian. Source: California Code of Regulation Sec. 7130.

Nutrition Counseling Provision of individualized advice and guidance to individuals who are at nutritional risk because of their health or nutritional history, dietary intake, medications use, or chronic illnesses, about options and methods for improving their nutritional status, performed by a Registered Dietitian in accordance with Sections 2585 and 2586, Business and Professions Code.

Nutrition Counseling Outreach Promotion of the Citywide Nutrition Education and Counseling Services program to eligible consumers. Outreach activities include but are not limited to disseminating promotional materials through the mail, at congregate meal settings, special events/fairs, or other group settings where the target population may gather. It may also include contacting eligible consumers at nutritional risk to schedule a nutrition counseling session with a Registered Dietitian (RD). A RD is not required to conduct nutrition counseling outreach.

III. Target Population

The target population is older adults and adults with disabilities living in the City and County of San Francisco who are at high nutritional risk as evidenced by the DETERMINE Checklist.

Grantee shall additionally target services to members of one or more of the following groups that have been identified as demonstrating the greatest economic and social need:

- Low Income
- Limited or No English Speaking Proficiency

- Minority populations
- LGBTQ+
- Frail

IV. Eligibility for Services

To participate in the nutrition education or counseling services, an individual must be enrolled in a DAAS-OOA funded congregate or home-delivered meal program. Priority shall go to individuals at high nutritional risk as evidenced by their score using the DETERMINE Checklist.

V. Description of Services

A. Citywide Nutrition Counseling

- 1. Grantee will provide nutrition counseling to consumers who are at high nutritional risk as evidenced by their score using the DETERMINE Checklist and to consumers who are determined to be at nutritional risk by a Registered Dietitian (RD) based on their health or nutritional history, dietary intake, medications use, or chronic illnesses. Nutrition counseling is the provision of individualized advice and guidance to individuals who are at nutritional risk, and is performed by an RD. Nutrition Counseling may also include referrals to other appropriate professional services or agencies. Consumers will be identified in CA-GetCare through a Citywide Nutrition Referral Dashboard.
- 2. Grantee will conduct nutrition counseling outreach to introduce and promote Citywide Nutrition Education and Counseling Services to eligible consumers. Outreach can include disseminating promotional materials through the mail, at congregate meal settings, special events/fairs, or other group settings where the target population may gather. It may also include contacting eligible consumers at nutritional risk to schedule a nutrition counseling session with a Registered Diletitian (RD). An RD is not required to conduct nutrition counseling outreach.

One nutrition counseling unit = One session of individualized nutrition counseling with an RD

One nutrition counseling hour = One hour of counseling provided One nutrition counseling outreach unit = One hour of outreach conducted

B. Citywide Nutrition Education/Group Classes

 Grantee will provide nutrition education classes to consumers who are enrolled in DAAS-OOA funded congregate meal programs. Nutrition education shall be relevant and meet the needs of the consumers. Classes are held at DAAS-OOA contractor or community partner sites that are easily accessible to consumers. Classes shall be conducted with a target of at least 12 consumers. Documentation of the class and attendance shall be documented and reported in CA-GetCare.

One nutrition class = one hour of nutrition education One nutrition education unit = One consumer attending a nutrition class

2. Grantee will ensure the nutrition education provided is culturally appropriate for the consumers registered. Translation is required if the majority of the consumers registered for the class are monolingual in a language other than English.

- 3. Grantee will have a signed agreement with the designated nutrition agencies to clarify the expectations and responsibilities between the parties involved and share a copy with DAAS-OOA.
- 4. Grantee will provide trainings to DAAS-OOA funded congregate staff/volunteers on the Eatfresh.org website and its online nutrition course.
- 5. Grantee will attend the quarterly in-service trainings coordinated and provided by DAAS-OOA and share the relevant information with their staff and volunteers.
- 6. Grantee will have to be compliant with the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996 (HIPAA) privacy and security rules.

VII. Outcome Objectives

- 1. At least 65% of consumers who received nutrition education and/or counseling services from the Grantee will report an increase in the consumption of fruits and vegetables and attribute it to the nutrition education and/or counseling services they received,* or will demonstrate an increase based on a change from previous baseline data captured in their annual nutrition risk screening using the DETERMINE Checklist.
- 2. At least 65% of consumers who received nutrition education services from Grantee will report making at least one healthy change as a result of the nutrition education and and/counseling services they received.*
- 3. At least 65% of consumers who received nutrition education services from Grantee will report that they feel more confident in knowing how to choose foods and beverages that are beneficial to overall health as a result of the nutrition education and and/counseling services they received.*
- 4. At least 65% of consumers who received nutrition education services from Grantee will report they feel more confident in knowing where to get help with nutrition education resources and/or nutrition counseling in their community.*

*Based on a DAAS-OOA approved workshop evaluation survey.

VI. Monitoring Activities

- 1. <u>Nutrition Program Monitoring</u>: Program monitoring will include review of specific program standards or requirements including the nutrition education material provided to consumers and the curriculum used for nutrition education classes; consumer eligibility and any targeted mandates, back up documentation for the units of services provided and all reporting including the log of service units which is based on the service provision hours; sign-in sheets of consumer records are collected and maintained if applicable; reporting performance including monthly service unit reports on CA-GetCare; agency and organization standards, which include current organizational chart, evidence of provision of training to staff regarding the elder abuse reporting annually; program operation, which includes a review of a written policies and procedures manual for the program; written project income policies if applicable, grievance policy and procedures; current site chart; a board of director list; and whether services are provided appropriately according to Sections V, VI, VII, VIII and XI.
- 2. <u>Fiscal Compliance and Contract Monitoring</u>: Fiscal monitoring will include review of the Grantee's organizational budget, the general ledger, quarterly balance sheet, cost allocation procedures and plan, State and Federal tax forms, audited financial statement, fiscal policy manual, supporting documentation for selected invoices, cash receipts and disbursement journals. The compliance monitoring will include review of Personnel Manual, Emergency Operations Plan, Compliance with the Americans with Disabilities Act, subcontracts, and MOUs, and the current board roster and selected board minutes for compliance with the Sunshine Ordinance.

VII. Reporting Requirements

1. Grantee will enroll eligible consumers in the program funded through this grant agreement through the CA-GetCare database as appropriate and in accordance to DAAS-OOA policies and procedures.

- 2. Grantee will enter and report into the Ca-GetCare all the units of service provided by the 5th working day of the month for the preceding month.
- 3. Grantee will provide a monthly report of activities as described in Section V. Grantee will enter the monthly metrics in the CARBON database by the 15th of the following month that includes the following information:
 - Number of unduplicated consumers served during the month.
 - Number of units of service provided during the month.
- 4. Grantee will provide an annual report summarizing the contract activities, referencing the tasks as described in Section VII and VIII, Service Objectives and Outcome Objectives, respectively. This report will also include accomplishments and challenges encountered by the Grantee. Grantee will enter the annual metrics in the CARBON database by the 15th of the month following the end of the program year.
- 5. Grantee shall issue a fiscal closeout report at the end of the fiscal year. The Grantee will submit the report to SF-HSA through CARBON system no later than July 31 each grant year.
- 6. Grantee will provide an annual report summarizing the contract activities, referencing the tasks as described in Section VI and VII, Service Objectives and Outcome Objectives, respectively. This report will also include accomplishments and challenges encountered by the Grantee. Grantee will enter the annual metrics in the CARBON database by the 15th of the month following the end of the program year.
- 7. Grantee shall issue a fiscal closeout report at the end of the fiscal year. The Grantee will submit the report to SF-HSA through CARBON system no later than July 31 each grant year.
- 8. Grantee will submit DAAS-OOA approved workshop evaluation survey data by the 15th of the month following the end of the program year.
- 9. Grantee shall develop and deliver an annual summary report of SOGI data collected in each grant year as requested by SF-HSA. The due date for submitting the annual summary report is no later than July 10th each grant year.
- 10. Grantee shall develop and deliver ad hoc reports as requested by SF-HSA and/or DAAS-OOA.
