FCS SIP Strategies

1. Intensity Prevention by Strengthening the Family Network and Support
2. Expand capacity to provide trauma-informed, attachment-based foster care to children and youth
3. Strengthen concurrent planning throughout the life of a case to promote permanency options for foster children and youth
4. Integrate implementation planning efforts to advance the integrated Core Practice Model and address the organizational change priorities emerging from the COHA process

Activities Include:

- **Prevention:** Resource Mapping, Mobil Response
- **Placement:** Resource Family Recruitment and Retention
- **Family Focused Planning and Engagement:** Case consultation, Child and Family Team Meetings, Red Teams (Differential Response), and bias training
- **Staff Development and Retention:** staff interviews, Chapin Hall study, supervisory framework
- **Analysis and Evaluation:** Child and Family Team Meetings, RED Teams, P1 case file reviews
