The Department of Human Services (DHS) requests authorization to enter into a contract with TEECOM for the period of October 1, 2016 to June 30, 2017, in the amount of \$49,200, plus a 10% contingency for a total amount not to exceed \$54,120. The purpose of this contract is to evaluate facility security camera systems at various Human Services Agency (HSA) and Department of Homeless and Supportive Housing (DHSH) sites.

Background

Some of the HSA sites require monitoring of the facility through security cameras. The current systems have been cobbled together over the years and are a combination of analog and digital equipment. The department is planning for a system-wide change of security systems to ensure the safety of its clients and staff.

Services to be Provided

TEECOM will evaluate HSA's current security camera systems and develop a set of recommendations that identify options for a new security system. Based on the recommendations, HSA will then issue a Request for Proposals for its installation.

This evaluation will determine the following:

- 1. Level of need for security surveillance camera at each site including sites with existing cameras
- 2. Appropriate location and positioning of cameras
- 3. Specifications for software and hardware including cloud storage solutions
- 4. Cost estimates and pricing options

Appendix A - Services to be Provided TEECOM Evaluation of Facility Security Camera Systems October 1, 2016 through June 30, 2017

I. Purpose of Contract

The purpose of this contract is to evaluate the current security camera systems at various Human Services Agency (HSA) and Department of Homeless and Supportive Housing (DHSH) sites.

HSA maintains service sites that require monitoring through security cameras to ensure the safety of the public. The current system has been cobbled together over the years and is a combination of analog and digital equipment. The department is planning for a system-wide change of security systems to ensure the safety of its clients and staff. Some of the DHSH sites included in this evaluation were identified when they were managed by HSA.

Through this contract, Contractor will evaluate HSA's current security camera systems and develop a set of recommendations that identify and lay out options for a new surveillance system. Based on the recommendations, HSA will then issue a Request for Proposals to install a new security system.

This evaluation will determine the following:

- 1. Level of needs for security cameras at each site including sites with existing cameras
- 2. Appropriate location and positioning of cameras
- 3. Specifications for software and hardware including cloud storage solutions
- 4. Cost estimates and Pricing options

IV. Description of Services

Contractor is expected to provide the following services during the term of this contract:

Physical Survey of Specified Locations

- Work with site coordinators to obtain data about current HSA and DHSH security systems. This may include blueprints, site maps, specifications for camera and other hardware and equipment.
- Physically survey each site to gather information about the current systems including locations of camera, the wiring, servers, and storage of video recording.

Evaluation Reporting

Once information about the current systems has been gathered, Contractor will:

- Provide a written evaluation of existing systems and software
- Make recommendations for improved equipment and systems including the following:
 - Specifications for the hardware and software
 - Pricing options for 1) replacing the existing systems and equipment, and
 2) preserving some of the existing systems and integrate with the new
 - Level of need for each locations (identifying what is needed and what is optional)
 - Optimal location of camera and its positioning that allows for optimal imagery
 - Imagery storage options including use of hard drive and cloud storage.
- Provide a proposed timeline for installation and rough pricing for purposes of estimation of project costs for system improvements
- The reports should be segregated by department: one for HSA sites and one for DHSH.
